Projects Accomplished

With help from the Road & Bridge department, the Fire District, and Search & Rescue we were able to clean up the Emergency Services Building compound and get it graveled.

In working with the Seismic Advisory Committee and the State we have been able to secure a project that will entail a detailed soil study for Teton County that will allow us to be able to better predict and prepare for liquefaction during an earthquake. The project will take place next year and will be done by the Idaho Geological Survey. This will be the first step in allowing us to more accurately model what damage will take place to us, in what locations, and to what magnitude from different seismic scenarios. This will allow us to focus our mitigation efforts on specific projects that will make the biggest difference in potential lives lost, critical infrastructure lost, and damage to public and private structures.

Selection of a contractor for the construction of the EOC radio room workstation has been finalized. The project will be about \$1,000.00 which was less than half of the next closest bidder. Tom Balben who has worked on other projects for the County, was awarded the project and will start around the 12th and expects to have it finished by the 20th.

With help from Search & Rescue and our ARES/RACES leader we have modified the mobile command vehicle to have a briefing area. This will allow us to have more flexibility in the way it is used and get our agencies using it more.

The enclosure for the generator for the old courthouse is finally on it's way and should be here on the 5th of August. After that Scott from the Fire District and myself will work on installing the enclosure and then Lucey electric will connect it to the building and we will finally have it up and going.

Upcoming Projects

In connection with our efforts to increase our level of preparedness for when our earthquake hits here in Teton County we have requested some training to help us with identifying non structural things we can do to protect our facilities as well as identifying potential seismic structural issues with our existing facilities. This training will take place on September 21st and 22nd at the Bonneville County Courthouse. There is no charge for this training.
