Defendant Sentenced in Broulim's Video Voyeurism Case

Today, defendant Roberto Bravo-Camacho was sentenced for three counts of Video Voyeurism and one count of Attempted Destruction or Concealment of Evidence, all felony offenses under Idaho Code, in connection with the placement of concealed video cameras in the upstairs men's and women's restrooms at the Broulim's grocery store in Driggs, Idaho. Mr. Bravo-Camacho pled guilty on all counts in Teton County District Court on June 21, 2022. Mr. Bravo-Camacho was sentenced by District Judge Steven Boyce.

For each count of Video Voyeurism, Mr. Bravo-Camacho was sentenced to 5 years imprisonment (1 year fixed plus 4 years indeterminate) with the sentences to run consecutively, meaning back-to-back. On the count of Attempted Destruction or Concealment of Evidence, Mr. Bravo-Camacho was sentenced to 2 years imprisonment (1 year fixed plus 1 year indeterminate) to run concurrently with the sentences on the other charges. This means that Mr. Bravo-Camacho will spend a minimum of 3 years and up to 15 years in prison for his crimes. In addition, Mr. Bravo-Camacho will be required to register as a sex offender, pay \$1,500 in fines, pay standard court costs and pay \$500 in reimbursement for the Teton County public defender services he received.

This case was investigated at length by the Teton County Sheriff's Office ("TCSO") and prosecuted by Teton County Prosecuting Attorney Bailey Smith. The Family Safety Network ("FSN") provided invaluable assistance providing support for the victims of Mr. Bravo-Camacho's criminal acts. The Teton County Office of the Prosecuting Attorney thanks TCSO and FSN for their excellent work.
